upfront citrus bitterness with a hint of caramel and citrus. Tropical fruit hop notes in the finish

Big Nose – Swamp Head Brewery – Florida

Strong bitterness and citrusy, resinous hop flavors

Hopsectitioner – Terrapin Brewing Company – Georgia

IPA – 7.3%ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Light copper in color, this IPA has an aroma of fresh pine and citrus. A strong malt backbone provides balance to an assertive hop bitterness.

Romantic Chemistry – Dogfish Head Brewery – Delaware

IPA – 7.2%ABV - \$7.50

Brewed with an intermingling of mangos, apricots and ginger, and then dry-hopped with three varieties of hops to deliver a tropical fruit aroma and a hop-forward finish.

Grapefruit Sculpin – Ballast Point - California

American IPA – 7%ABV - \$7.50

Made with grapefruit. The tart, fresh fruit flavor really enhances the citrus aroma of the hops

Ee tah! - Anderson Valley Brewing Co. – California

IPA – 7.5%ABV – \$6.00

Bright, golden yellow color with aromas of rich tropical fruit, passion fruit with a hint of citrus. Pale, pilsner, and midnight wheat malts give a solid malt character. Chinook, Citra, and Amarillo hops impart flavors of ripe tropical fruit, peach and apricot leading to a clean hoppy finish

Delivers a payload of good ol' American hops straight to your palate, bursting with flavors of grapefruit and pineapple. Smooth caramel malts swoop in to balance out the finish

Flavor boost of mango with citrus hops and low ABV combine to make this easy drinking session

Double IPA's

Also known as "Imperial IPA," a higher ABV, hoppier version of the standard IPA. Robust, malty, and high hop profile.

Imperial Black IPA – 9.3%ABV – 12oz – \$8.50

Brewed with hemp seed. Toasty, chocolatey dark malts align with astronomical amount of hops

Pale Ales

American pale ales are light in color and defined by American hops which have high bitterness and aroma. English pale ales are characteristically dry with defined hop taste and more malt balance.

Crisp hop bite balanced by a zesty pop of bright orange flavor

Dale's Pale Ale – Oskar Blues Brewery – Colorado

Assertive, yet balanced, flavors of pale malt and citrusy hops

Original – North Peak – Michigan

Pilsners

The world's first golden lager. Crisp, light, and flavorful beer that showcases the flavor of continental European noble hops.

Brown Ales and Dark Lagers

English brown ales are one of Englands oldest beer styles. The less intense precursor to porters features rich, often sweet malt flavors. American brown ales usually feature more hop character and higher alcohol content.

Imperial Brown Ale – 7.3% ABV – 22oz – \$32.00

Rich brown ale with vanilla notes, aged on African Padauk and Sugar Maple

Indian Brown Ale – Dogfish Head – Delaware

Dark IPA – 7.2%ABV – 12oz - \$5.50

Well-hopped and malty at the same time. A cross between a Scotch Ale, an India Pale Ale and an American Brown.

BaBa Black Lager – Uinta Brewing Company – Utah

Black Lager – 4% ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Robust and smooth, dominated by nutty, chocolaty roasted malt flavors

Amber Ales

Richly flavored, sweet, hoppy beers. Reddish/orange color and a sweet malt flavor from caramel malts and strong hop character often including grassy notes from dry hopping.

Boont Amber – Anderson Valley Brewing Co. – California

Amber Ale – 5.8%ABV - \$6.00

Rich, crystal malts give this beer a deep copper hue and contribute a slight caramel sweetness while the herbal, spicy bitterness from whole-cone hops impart a crisp, clean finish. Hints of sun toasted grain, toffee, and fruity esters compliment the mellow, noble hop aroma.

Deep Roots – Red Cypress – Florida

American Amber Ale – 5.4%ABV – 12oz – \$5.00

A refreshing hybrid of German and American styles. Aromas of crusty baked bread, a balanced hop bitterness and a clean, dry finish.

Beerito – Oskar Blues Brewery – Colorado

Amber/ Vienna Lager – 4% ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Light bodied Mexican-style lager with walnut, toasted bread, and honey malt flavors

Lagers

Bottom fermenting beers, fermented at low temperatures. Clean tasting and usually crisp allowing malt and hops to shine through. Generally more complex flavors than an ale.

Summerfest – Sierra Nevada Brewing Company – California

Lager – 5%ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Crisp, golden, dry, and drinkable. Delicate and complex malt flavor and spicy, floral hop character—the perfect warm weather beer.

El Sully – 21st Amendment Brewery – California

Mexican Style Lager – 4.8%ABV - \$5.00

A crisp Mexican-style lager with light notes of spice from Northern Brewer hops.

Weihenstephaner Original – Bayerische Staatsbrauerei Weihenstephan – Germany

Helles Lager – 5.1% ABV – 16.9oz – \$8.50

Bright yellow lager, mild hoppy note with a pleasantly fresh spicy taste

Brooklyn Lager – Brooklyn Brewery – New York

Amber Lager – 5.2% ABV – 16.9oz – \$5.50

Pre-Prohibition recipe; dry hopped, fresh, and flowery

Tampa Style Lager – Cigar City – Florida

Lager – 4.5%ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Inspired by the traditional German-style Helles, which translates to “light colored.” Perfect for the Florida heat, it’s a beer that’s made for drinkin’ when it’s truly hotter than helles outside.

V-Twin – Motorworks Brewing – Florida

Vienna Lager – 4.7%ABV – 12oz - \$5.50

Light toasted Munich malt aroma with a moderate, but firm, hop bitterness to balance out the rich Vienna malt taste. Slightly creamy mouthfeel that dries in the finish.

Cream Ales

Cream ale is a style of American beer, often light in color and are well attenuated. During Prohibition in the United States, Canadian brewers took up brewing cream ale, refining it to some degree. Following the end of Prohibition in the United States, cream ale from Canada became popular and the style was produced anew in both nations.

Genesee –North American Breweries – New York

Cream Ale – 5.1% ABV – 12oz – \$3.50

Full flavor of an ale with a light lager body, sweet corn notes, and virtually no bitterness

Shapes (Former) – Mikkeller - California

Blonde Ale – 5.6%ABV - \$5.50

Slightly spicy, Belgianesque take on a blonde cream ale

Kölsch/Alt

Originally only brewed in Cologne, Germany. Top fermented beer with light to medium body and very pale color. Medium hop bitterness and dry flavor.

Freigeist Ottekolong - Braustelle - Germany

Unfiltered Kölsch – 4.8% - \$10.00

Lack of filtration gives mild rustic character. Maltier than a standard kölsch. Soft, fresh and easy drinking.

Münster Alt – Brauerei Pinkus – Germany

Altbier – 5.1% ABV – 16.9oz – \$10.00

Brewed from organic grain and hops, herbaceous and fruity with a long, dry finish

Wheat/ White Beers

Wheat beers are pale to dark gold and medium bodied. Light, bready wheat aroma and flavor. Clove or banana flavor can come from yeast. Wit (white) beers are brewed with unmalted wheat and are spiced.

Pooltime Ale – Bells Brewing Co – Michigan

Wheat Ale – 5.2%ABV - \$5.50

Belgian-inspired Wheat Ale with light clove notes. Cherry juice adds a subtle tartness and bright counterpoint to the other flavors, enhancing the fruity character and making it the perfect beer for all summer activities.

Miami Weiss – MIA Brewing Co. – Florida

Hefeweizen Style Ale – 6%ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Brewed with wheat, barley, and sweet orange peel. This unfiltered hefe produces vanilla, banana, and bubblegum esters.

XIV (La Quatorze) – Brasserie des Franches-Montagnes – Switzerland

Weizenbock – 7.5% ABV – 12oz – \$18.00

Strong wheat beer brewed with coffee beans

Floridian – Funky Buddha Brewing Company – Florida

German Style Hefeweizen – 5.2% ABV – 12oz – \$5.50

Unfiltered and refreshing with a thick wheat malt body and notes of banana, citrus, and clove

Wittekerke – De Brabandere – Belgium

Belgian White Ale – 5%ABV – 12oz - \$4.50

Easy drinking with very subtle citrus flavor. Very light and mild.

Porters

Black or chocolate malt gives the porter its dark color. Well hopped and heavily malted. Medium bodied and can range from bitter to mild.

Night Swim – Coppertail Brewing Company – Florida

Porter – 6.2% ABV – 12oz – \$5.00

Dark and luxurious like a midnight dip in the warm waters off St. Pete Beach. Rich and roasty with a hint of chocolate. Both this porter, and a night swim, are best enjoyed with a friend.

Flag Porter – Darwin Brewery – England

English Porter – 5% ABV – 12oz – \$6.50

Brewed with yeast salvaged from an 1825 shipwreck, roasty with bittersweet chocolate notes

Taddy Porter – Samuel Smith Brewery - England

Porter – 5%ABV – 12oz –

Very dark, fairly full in body and packed with flavor. Intense, dry tangy character of roasted barley. Brewed with well water from the original well sunk in 1758.

Entire Butt – Salopian Brewing Co. – England

English Porter – 12oz - \$5.50

Historically the term used to describe a porter blended from a variety of ales, entire butt uses 14 different malts and 3 hops to recreate this forgotten style of porter.

Sweet Baby Jesus – Duclaw Brewing Co. – Maryland

Porter – 6.5%ABV – \$5.50

Chocolate Peanut Butter with, full body and creamy, luxurious mouthfeel. Lightly sweet, malty flavor accented by rich flavors of chocolate, coffee and peanut butter. Finishes smooth, dry, and roasty with lingering notes of chocolate and peanut butter so savory, you will exclaim its name!

Imperial Stouts

Extra strong version of a stout. Inspired by brewers back in the 1800's to win over the Russian Czar, this is the king of stouts. High alcohol % and plenty of malt character. Low to moderate levels of carbonation with huge roasted, chocolate, and burnt malt flavours.

Even More Jesus – Evil Twin Brewing Co. – Connecticut

Imperial Stout – 12%ABV – 16oz - \$11.50

Thick fudge-like body, pitch black color, aromas of chocolate, coffee, dark fruits and muscovado sugar. Only made in limited amounts.

Dark Truth – Boulevard Brewing Co. – Missouri

Imperial Stout – 9.7%ABV 12oz - \$8.50

Layered with complex flavors of espresso, roasted fig, crème brûlée. Belgian yeast provides a plum-like fruitiness, noble German hops reveal spicy, herbal notes, while the rich, velvety mouthfeel mellows to a dry, smoky finish.

Imperial Stouts

Birthday Bomb! – Prairie Artisan Ales – Oklahoma

Imperial Stout – 13%ABV – 12oz - \$26.00

Aged on coffee, chocolate, vanilla, chilies, and caramel. Sweet, rich, and full bodied with warm chili touch.

Triangulation – Perrin Brewing – Michigan

Imperial Oatmeal Stout - 9%ABV – 12oz – \$9.50

Collaboration with Cigar City and Oskar Blues. Numerous specialty malts combine with a multitude of experimental hops with the specific intention of creating a complex and nuanced twist on the style.

Sunday Morning Stout – Weyerbacher Brewing Co. – Pennsylvania

Imperial Stout – 12.7% - 12oz - \$9.00

Aged in bourbon barrels. Strong coffee and roasted malt. Mild chocolate, vanilla and caramel flavors.

Wake Up Dead - Left Hand Brewing - Colorado

Russian Imperial Stout - 10.2%ABV - 22oz - \$18.00

Hints of raisins, black licorice, coffee and dark chocolate followed by earthy, herbal hop notes

Péché Mortel – Dieu du Ciel – Canada

Imperial Stout – 9.5% ABV – 12oz – \$14.00

Infused with fair trade coffee during brewing for intensified bitterness and a powerful coffee taste

Wake - n - Bake – Terrapin Beer Co.- Georgia

Imperial Stout – 9.4%ABV – 12oz -n \$8.50

Coffee is added to this imperial stout, dark chocolate, bitter coffee, oatmeal, and roasted malts

Siberian Night - Thirsty Dog Brewing - Ohio

Russian Imperial Stout - 9.7%ABV – 12oz - \$10.00

Full bodied and nicely bitter with dark roasted coffee, dark bitter chocolate, and roasted malt

Black Chocolate Stout – Brooklyn Brewing – New York

Imperial Stout – 10%ABV – 12oz – \$7.50

Blending of six malts and three distinct mashes creates a dark chocolate aroma and flavor best paired with fine cheeses, desserts, or roaring fireplaces.

Old Rasputin – North Coast Brewing Company – California

Imperial Stout – 9% ABV – 12oz – \$7.50

Loaded with chocolate and coffee flavors, with a sweetness nicely balanced by hops

Stouts

Dark beer made using roasted malt or roasted barley. Darker and stronger than a porter. The first stout was a "stout porter" just a shortened version of "strong porter," made when brewers were experimenting with strengthening porters in the late 1700's.

Milk Stout – Left Hand Brewing – Colorado

Milk Stout – 6%ABV – 12oz - \$5.50

Roasted malt and coffee flavors build the foundation of this creamy sweet stout. Milk sugar in your stout is like cream in your coffee. Dark and delicious, America's great milk stout will change your perception about what a stout can be. Udderly delightful.

Neopolitan Milk Stout – Saugatuck Brewing Co. – Michigan

Milk Stout – 6%ABV – 12oz - \$8.00

A perfect blend of classic dry stout character with brilliant flavors of Neopolitan Ice Cream. Experience the nostalgic flavors of chocolate, vanilla and strawberry all in one glass – because sometimes ice cream just isn't enough.

Tiny – Weyerbacher Brewing Co. – Pennsylvania

Imperial Stout – 11.8%ABV – 12oz – \$8.00

Belgian inspired imperial stout with big chocolate and roasted notes that are balanced by Belgian flavors from the abbey yeast strain. Very smooth and lacking in astringency you sometimes find in these imperial stouts.

Fruit/ Herb/ Spice Beers

Light, flavored beers. Hidden malt and hop flavor allows fruit or herb to dominate.

Never Nude – Red Cypress – Florida

Fruit Beer/Wheat Ale – 5.5%ABV – 12oz - \$7.00

Generously hopped and brewed with 2,000 blueberries giving it a blue color and fruit taste

Del's Shandy – Narragansett Brewing Company – Rhode Island

Shandy – 5% ABV – 16.9oz – \$5.50

Classic Narragansett lager mixed with lemonade, easy drinking and refreshing

Profondo Rosso – Birrificio del Ducato – Italy

Fruit Beer – 6% ABV – 12oz – \$30.00

Tart blended ale with cherries, raspberries, and red grapes

Le Meule – Brasserie des Franches-Montagnes – Switzerland

Spice Ale – 6% ABV – 12oz – \$15.00

Honey sweet blond beer brewed with sage for a bitter herbal kick

Ciders

Made from the fermented fruit juice. Can range in color and taste. Usually fruity and can be dry to sweet.

Ginger Perry – Argus Cidery – Texas

Pear Cider – 4.5% ABV – 12oz – \$6.50

Spicy, dry, unfiltered, and unpasteurized with a mild ginger finish

Ananas – Slim Pickens Cider and Mead – Florida

Cider – 6%ABV – 12oz. - \$7.50

Juicy pineapple flavor with mild carbonation. Free of additives, sulfites, and gluten.

Scottish/ Scotch Ales, Barleywines, Old Ales

Old ale is a style of English beer featuring complex flavors produced by long aging, often in wood. Scotch ale is not that stylistically different from Old ales or Barley wines. The name however became regionalized in the 19th century so that a strong pale ale from Scotland became known as a Scotch ale or Wee Heavy. Barleywines are strong, sweet ales characterized by high ABV, strong flavors of sherry or fruit, and a complex sweet malt character.

Amburana Barleywine – Cervejaria Way – Brazil

Barleywine – 12.1% ABV – 12oz – \$15.00

Aged in Amburana wood barrels for 12 months, imparts a sweet punch to pronounced alcohol

Torbata – Almond '22 – Italy

English Barleywine – 8.7%ABV – 11.2oz - \$18.00

Moderately smoked, lightly hopped ale brewed with honey and orange zest

J.W. Lees Harvest Ale (2001 Vintage) – J.W. Lees – England

Barleywine – 11.5% ABV – 12oz – \$21.50

Vintage barleywine with highly developed flavors of toffee, raisins, butterscotch, and burnt sugar

#100 – Nøgne Ø – Norway

Barleywine – 10% ABV – 16.9oz – \$23.50

Warming with malty notes of raisin, apricot, and butterscotch

Traquair House Ale – Traquair House – Scotland

Scotch Ale – 7.2% ABV – 16.9oz – \$23.50

Fermented in oak, malty, full bodied with notes of red fruit, toffee and chocolate

Old Chub – Oskar Blues – Colorado

Scotch Ale – 8%ABV – 12oz - \$5.50

Brewed with malted barley, specialty grains, and a dash of beechwood smoked malt

Belgian Trappist Ales

Brewed in monasteries by or under control of monks. Top fermented and usually bottle conditioned. Ranging in colors with a typically strong, malty, and yeasty taste. Eleven breweries make authentic Trappist beers: 6 in Belgium, 2 in the Netherlands, 1 in Austria, 1 in Italy, and 1 in the USA.

Mont des Cats – Mont des Cats – France

Belgian Amber Strong Ale – 7.6% ABV – 24oz – \$30.00

Brewed by Chimay monks, caramel sweetness with hints of dried fruits and earthy hop character

Straffe Hendrick Brugs Quadrupel – Huisbrouwerij De Halve Maan – Belgium

Quadrupel – 11% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Rich and intense with malt flavors of plums, vanilla, and caramel

Orval – Brasserie d'Orval – Belgium

Belgian Pale Ale – 6.2% ABV – 12oz – \$14.00

Intensely aromatic and dry with a slight tartness and herbal, earthy tones

Rochefort 8 – Brasserie de Rochefort – Belgium

Belgian Strong Dark Ale – 9.2% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Iconic monk-brewed ale with flavors of caramel, dark fruit, and Belgian spice

Chimay Cinq Cents (White) – Bières de Chimay – Belgium

Tripel – 8% ABV – 12oz – \$12.00

Golden and hazy with fruity notes of muscat grapes and raisins

St Bernardus Prior 8 – Brouwerij St. Bernardus – Belgium

Dubbel – 8% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Hazy brown, big body, sweet malt with toasty caramel flavors

St Bernardus Abt 12 – Brouwerij St. Bernardus – Belgium

Quadrupel – 10% ABV – 12oz – \$15.00

Dark, bold, and boozy with a long bittersweet finish

Maredsous 8 Bruin – Duvel Moortgat – Belgium

Dubbel – 8% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Roasted malt imparts a mahogany color with caramel and fruity touches

Belgian Strong Ales

Vary from pale to dark brown. Hop flavor can range from low to high. Medium to full bodied with high alcoholic character.

Strong Amber Ale – 9% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Brewed with 6 different malts for a ruby red body with tart apricot and cherry flavors

Baladin Leön – Beerificio Le Baladin – Italy

Belgian Strong Dark – 9%ABV - \$17.00

Leön enchants with the explosion of aromas that recall a festive world of sweet loafing. Founded as a Christmas beer it's unforgettable for its chocolate notes which blend with scents of dried fruit, licorice and toffee

25 Dodici – Birra del Borgo – Italy

Strong Amber Ale – 9.5% ABV – 12oz – \$20.00

Malty caramel flavors, brewed with bitter orange peel and raisins

Piraat Ale – Brouwerij Van Steenberge N.V. – Belgium

Strong Pale Ale – 10.8%ABV – 750mL - \$27.00

Belgian Strong Pale Ale, re-fermented with Bordeaux wine yeast

Ara Bier – De Dolle Brouwers – Belgium

Golden Strong Ale – 7.8% ABV – 12oz – \$15.00

Light bready malts, citrusy hops, earthy and slightly sour

Gouden Carolous Noel – Brouwerij Het Anker – Belgium

Strong Dark Ale – 10.5% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Dark ruby red ale, six different kinds of herbs and spices and three different kinds of hops

Val Dieu Winter – Brasserie de l'Abbaye du Val-Dieu – Belgium

Strong Dark Ale – 10.5% ABV – 25oz – \$28.00

Complex and full bodied beer spiced with anise, orange peel, and coriander

Hitachino XH – Kiuchi Brewery – Japan

Strong Brown Ale – 8% ABV – 12oz – \$13.00

Matured in Sake barrels and then Shochu casks for 3 months, very malty and strong smelling

Maledetta – Birra del Borgo – Italy

Belgian Amber Ale – 6.2% – 12oz – \$18.00

Flavors of toffee and orange peel with mild bitterness and a dry finish

Dancing Pierre – Central 28 Beer Company – Florida

Belgian Pale Ale - 5.9%ABV – 12oz - \$5.50

Dances along the incredibly delicate balance between fruity, spicy aromatics, assertive bitterness, and deep malt character. It's a difficult balance, slightly akin to riding on a unicycle while juggling. Never easy, but always impressive.

Belgian Golden Strong Ale – 8% ABV – 12oz – \$14.50

Spicy and peppery with a gentle hop bouquet and wild yeast; aged in oak barrels

Flemish Red

Typically light-bodied, reddish-brown colors and distinct sharp, fruity, sour and tart flavors which are created by special yeast strains. Very complex beers, they are produced under the age old tradition of long-term cask aging (a year or more) in oak, and the blending of young and old beers. Strong fruit flavor and moderate to strong sour or acidic taste.

Flanders Red Ale – 5.8%ABV – 750mL – \$47.00

Ale matured in a combination of whiskey, bourbon and burgundy red wine barrels. Brewed with late summer foraged fruit. Tart berry sweetness with vanilla and vinious flavor.

Ale aged on cherries. Traditional Belgian Kriek, pleasingly tart with a touch of sweetness.

Aged 2 years in oak vats, woody and fruity with balsamic vinegar notes

Farmhouse Ales/ Saisons

Originally brewed seasonally to refresh farm workers during harvest season. Historically saisons did not share identifiable characteristics, but were rather a group of refreshing summer ales. Each farm brewer would make their own distinct version. Commonly fruity, cloudy golden and relatively high hopped.

Mixed culture saison with manzanita flowers, berries, and wood. Fermented in oak.

Classic Straffe Hendrick fermented with wild Brettanomyces yeast

A golden, naturally cloudy, bottle conditioned artisan farmhouse ale. Dry hopped for a perfectly refreshing balance of spicy malts, hop, and yeast.

Wild Ales

Wild ales are beers that are introduced to wild yeast or bacteria. This introduction may occur from oak barrels that have been previously inoculated, pitched into the beer, or gained from various "sour mash" techniques. Funky flavor profile that can vary from light or dark, hoppy or malty and often having sour notes as well as barnyard/earthy characteristics.

Aged for one year in burgundy wine casks, tart and vinous with burnt chocolate and cherry

Plum Sour Stout – Destihl Brewery – Illinois

Sour Stout – 5.6%ABV – 12oz. - \$7.00

Bold fusion of fruitiness and chocolatey roast. Light bodied and refreshingly tart.

Funky Gold Simcoe – Prairie Artisan Ales – Oklahoma

Dry hopped sour ale with crisp citrus and green apple notes, funky yeast, and lingering bitterness

Lambics

Lambic beers are left in open vats where wild yeast and bacteria take up residence. Once the fermentation process begins, the beer is stored in barrels and left to age for up to three years, resulting in a wild, funky, sour beer with mild carbonation, a cloudy appearance, and a thick mouthfeel. After fermentation and barrel aging the various batches are compared and blended.

A top-fermented beer that originated in Goslar, Germany. A Gose will have a low hop bitterness and a complementary dryness and spice from the use of ground coriander seeds and a sharpness from the addition of salt. Dominant flavours include tartness, an herbal characteristic, and a strong saltiness.

Berliner Weisse

A top fermented, bottle conditioned wheat beer with a low ABV and refreshing, tart, sour, and acidic characteristics. The fermentation takes place with a mixture of yeast and lactic acid bacteria (giving the lactic acid taste) The berliner is a regional variation on the white beer style from Northern Germany, dating back to at least the 16th century.

Tart and bright. Light bodied with wheat and lactic sourness
